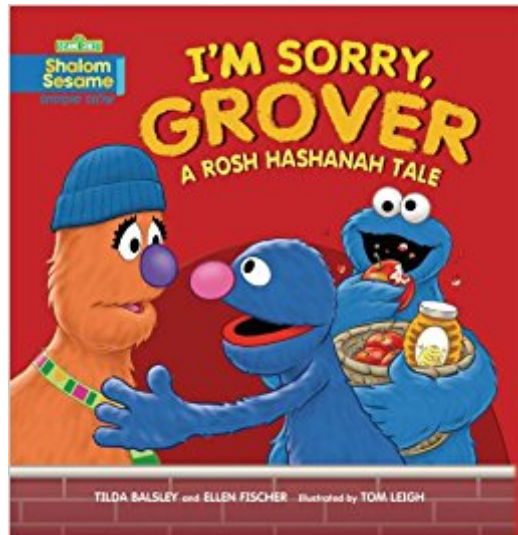




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# I'm Sorry, Grover: A Rosh Hashanah Tale (Shalom Sesame)

The children at preschool love this book. Sesame Street characters catch their eye and it pulls the children in. What a wonderful find!

Grover tells the story of how his friend Brosh learns to become an even better friend in the Hebrew New Year. Brosh loses his wooly hat and he and Cookie Monster trace his steps from when he remembers having it last. He has been at different places and with different people across town.

Brosh thinks someone has taken it, maybe even a friend of his. Children will be taught a Hebrew greeting associated with Rosh Hashanah, the Hebrew New Year and what foods are eaten during the High Holidays. A great story for children about the Hebrew New Year! It does a great job of showing how to try to solve a problem, retracing the steps of when Brosh remembered seeing his woolly cap last, and that jumping to conclusions is usually not the best route to take. It also models forgiveness and how people can move on past how they have hurt each other and remain friends. Created for children ages 2-6 / grades PK-1
