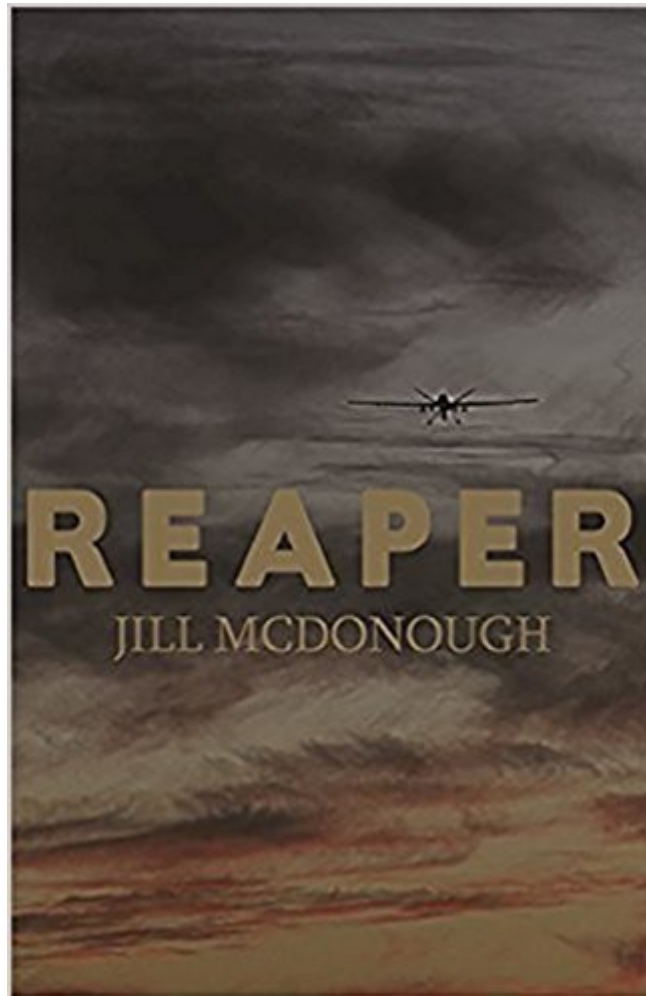

She's received fellowships from the National Endowment for the Arts, the Fine Arts Work Center, the New York Public Library, the Library of Congress, and Stanford's Stegner program, and taught incarcerated college students through Boston University's Prison Education Program for thirteen years. Her work has appeared in Poetry, Slate, The Nation, The Threepenny Review, and Best American Poetry. She directs the MFA program at UMass-Boston and 24 Pearl Street, the Fine Arts Work Center online.

With a casual, even flirtatious tone the poet lures us into reflections around the wonder and damage of our latest technology, featuring drones and robots. McDonough's villanelles with their leaden yet feverish repetition especially make the triumph and the terror of drones vivid.
