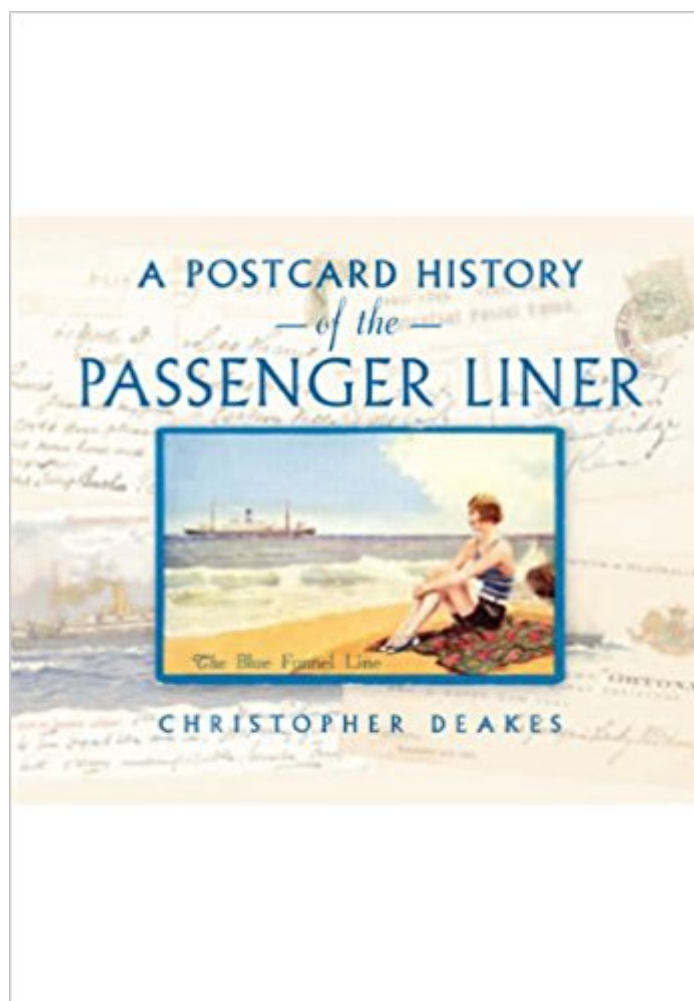

This work's title suggests that it is a history of postcards of passenger liners. O.K. - that's a huge subject to tackle in just one book. This book does show some very rare cards of lesser known liners (most welcome!) and beautiful art work from lesser known maritime artists (also most welcomed). Perhaps the author was just a bit fixated in this area. No problem. He has done an outstanding job of research. I would welcome further books on this subject from him. I have collected ocean liner postcards for over fifty years and many of these cards are totally new to me. I can recommend this book to all who love the subject.
