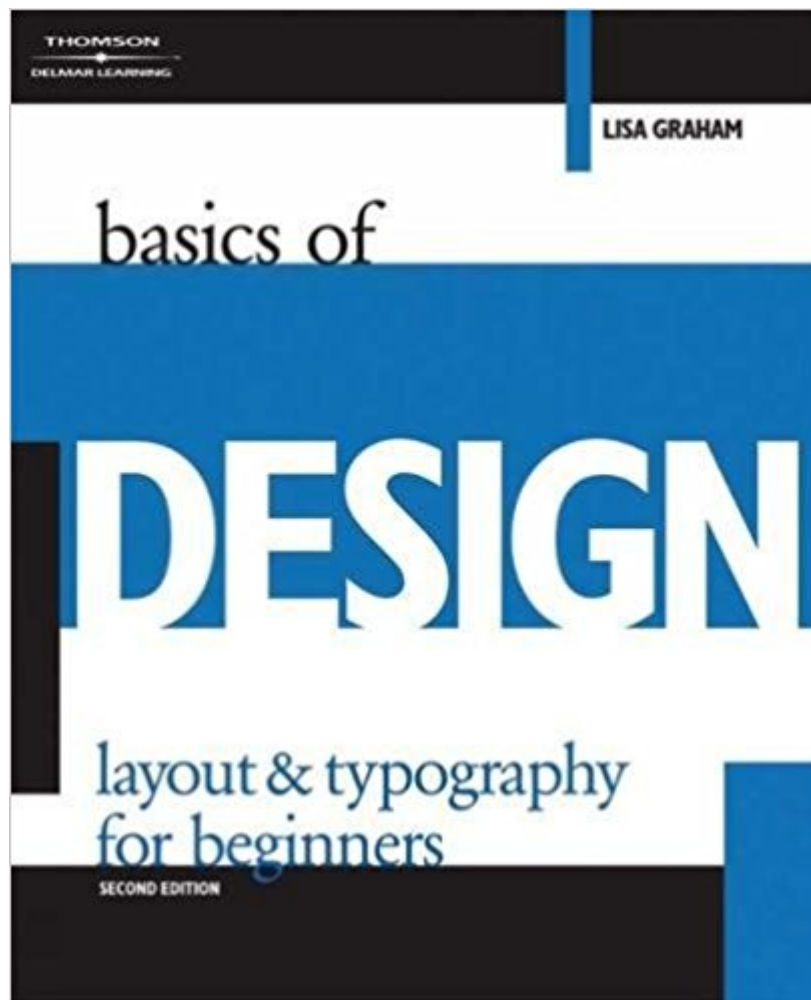

This is a really simple book which offers BEGINNING graphic design students a source of simplified information about layouts and type. This book is directed towards purely beginner designers and students who are in the intro classes. I wouldn't suggest this book if you have ANY prior knowledge of graphic design, but I whole heartedly suggest this book to any student who is just starting out. With that being said, there are other books out there that offer more valueable information, but this book is a good simplified source of information that is easy to take in and understand. This book is a good starting point.

The book is "designed" for beginners. It is great for brainstorming about - say - crafting a corporate identity using logos, newsletters, business cards, etc. However it is dated. Few pages are in color. The author doesn't assume the reader has access to industry-standard design software like the Adobe Creative Suite, or even to a computer for that matter. The author sometimes suggests the reader use crayons to "recreate" various design techniques involving color. But the basics are there, the principles are well explained and the price is right. Skip over the dated stuff and use the book to get a good foundational intro to the world of layout and design.

I bought this book for my DIGM class at the University of Houston, and it is a great guide to layouts, presentation in writing, posters, ect. In all printed materials, it is always best to make sure the print is legible, makes a good statement and can capture the audiences attention.

Purchased this textbook for a fundamentals of design course. It is a decent text, and worth the used book price I paid of about \$25. Nothing I would keep in my library for future use, unless one is completely unfamiliar with design principles.
