

For more than two hundred years, Unitarians and Universalists have affirmed that "ministry" can take place anywhere in the world: in city streets and hospital rooms, on the battlefield and the boardroom, in college classrooms and city jails. And for

two hundred years, we have struggled to balance our affirmation of these diverse ministries with the equally precious insight that each local congregation has the authority to order the ministries that take place within it. The Unitarian congregations of Boston took one important step when they selected Joseph Tuckerman as a “minister at large” in 1824; the congregations that comprise the Unitarian Universalist Association took another when they affirmed the equal status of community ministers, religious educators, and parish ministers in 1991. And for twenty-five years, the Society for Community Ministries (originally the Society for the Larger Ministry) has supported and sustained community ministers while leading the struggle for their wider recognition within Unitarian Universalism. Called to Community represents another important step forward. The fullest articulation of community ministry to date, this volume blends theology, history, and pastoral vignettes.
