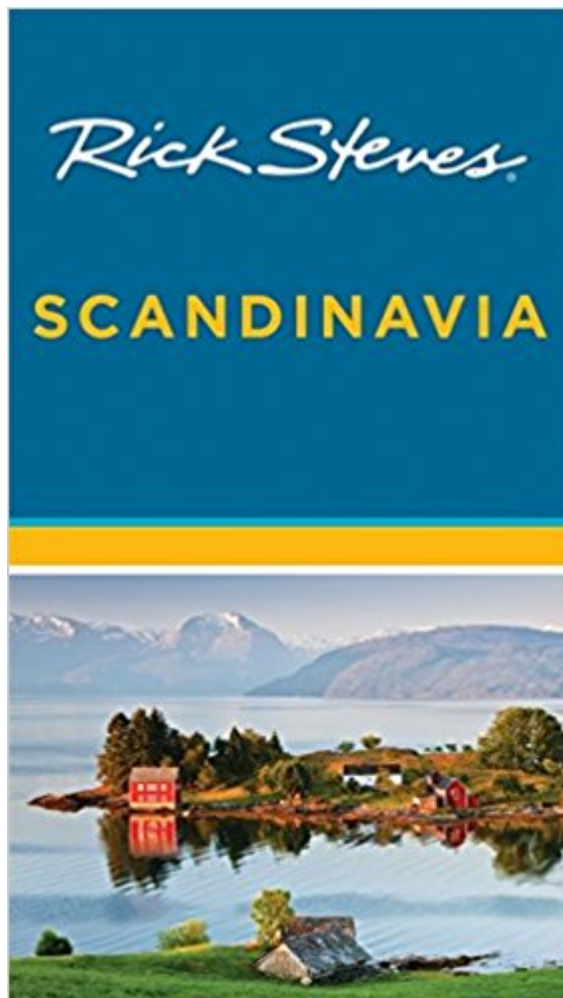

Since it focusses on a couple of places extensively, with handy, informative city walks and lots of info about eating, sleeping and transportation, but skips entire parts of the Scandinavian countries, this guide is very good, and perhaps even more useful than the Lonely Planet, if you only visit those places described in the book and not the rest. Not all major destinations are listed, e.g. Trondheim and GÅfÅteborg are missing, hence my 4 out of 5 stars, but even with those cities missing I though it a very useful book. The city walks are excellent and somehow we often ended up in restaurants that were listed. I bought the ebook version which was very convenient on both phone and tablet, the only disadvantage being that you have to browse quite a bit between the city walk maps and the (very informative) written description. Places described in this guide book:-

Copenhagen- Near Copenhagen (Roskilde and a few other sights)- Central Denmark (ÅfÆ'Å â rÅfÆ'Å Å, ÅfÆ'Å â rÅfÆ'Å Å, skÅfÆ'Å Å,bing, Odense)- Jutland (Aarhus, Legoland, Jelling, Himmelbjerget, Silkeborg (but oddly enough no mention is made of the main sight of the town, the Silkeborg Museum with the naturally mummified corpse of the Tollund man), Ribe)- Oslo- A tour suggestion via FIÅfÆ'Å Å¥m, Aurland and the Undredal- Sognefjord- Gudbrandsdal Valley and Jotunheimen Mountains- Bergen- South Norway (Stavanger, Setesdal, Hovden, Kristiansand)- Stockholm- Near Stockholm (Sigtuna, Uppsala)- Stockholm's Archipelago- Southeast Sweden (VÅfÅxjÅfÅ, Glass Country, Kalmar, Åfâ "land)- Helsinki- Tallinn

Really helpful. Lists exact places with directions for laundry coin-ops, tells exactly where to go to purchase train tickets in each city, gives suggestions to save money but also make the most of your time. I wish it included more cities and locations in the whole of Sweden, other than just the South Eastern portion and Stockholm. The country is huge!!!!!! Also, saying "I don't really like the countryside because, well, I'm Norwegian," isn't very professional. I know you're "kidding", but as a 1/2 Swede, I also know that you're not. lol. Suggetion would be a "sweden" book of its own, Including Gothenburg and hamlets, islands, etc., on the Western coast of Sweden; more towns, cities, explorations, etc. along the Eastern coast (Bosthnia Coast), Central Sweden-- the heartlands (Dalarna, Ostersund, etc.), and maybe even Northern. Also, I'm going to Vilnius, Lithuania as well, and although you have Helsinki and Tallinn in this book (even though they're NOT Scandinavia countries either), there's nothing on Vilnius, and I can't find any other publications you have made in the recent past on Vilnius or the Baltics... the last one was published around 1998 and is totally

outdated! Your information and resources are SO good when you cover towns... how about covering more of Sweden and making a Sweden book, and also updating your Baltics book. Thank you, Rick Steves!!!

I especially liked Steve's Norway in a Nutshell trip you can take on your own. We skipped the expensive, shorter excursion offered by the cruise ship and saved enough to pay for all of our tour books. We visited all of the Scandinavian countries and used this book before docking in each major city, as well as in Tallinn, Estonia. Warning: the book makes you want to go back for more!
