

Sifting through the stories of his miracles and poetry, we emerge with a picture of Nanak, the man. Also exploring the histories of all the subsequent Gurus after Nanak, the book traces the story of how an unorganized spiritual movement evolved into the institutionalized Khalsa of Guru Gobind Singh. Through the journeys of all the Gurus, the book describes how Nanak the poet became Guru Nanak the saint.

Another lesson for us modern folk. The Guru Granth Sahib contains the

poems of a Sufi saint. The sheer brilliance of the book casts a luminous light on the ways of Nanak, and this is a great service that Haroon Khalid has done us. It is indeed marvellous, and is a book that needs to be widely read.
